I am pleased to say that at the end of the calendar year, we swung the pendulum the other way, and had a cash surplus of \$100,000! This remarkable turnaround, achieved in such a short time, is a testament to the power of the collaborative spirit of our team of colleagues, working together to further our mission. Our accreditors, the Association of Theological Schools, who visited us recently, were *very* impressed and commended us for our progress, current situation, and prospects for the future. This represents an unprecedented milestone for us, a testament to the strength and resilience of our community, especially after a period of intense challenges. It is a privilege for me to share news of this transformative progress and renewed beginnings with you–our students, alumni, donors, hierarchs, supporters, and friends–and to celebrate the opportunities that lie ahead.

St Vladimir's now stands on a fresh, newly laid foundation, built on the bedrock of Christ's Church and our rich legacy and tradition on our historic Crestwood campus.

Fr Schmemann's visionary leadership shaped Orthodox Christianity in America. As Dean, he cultivated a vibrant intellectual community, inspiring generations of seminarians. We are eager to focus vigilantly on the student experience, and I and my colleagues humbly serve the Church following in his footsteps. We carry this beautiful torch forward as we renew our seminary, honoring cherished traditions like this lecture while prayerfully working towards an even brighter future.

Tonight, we are blessed to have with us Dr Henry Maguire, a renowned scholar of Byzantine art, and his wife, Dr Eunice Maguire. We accept with gratitude their magnanimous visit and financial generosity to our Seminary. Thank you and welcome!
